### THE FIRST TRIP AROUND THE WORLD

[1] In geography class we talked about which are the continents that make up our world.

For this reason, my colleague Ismael asked which was the farthest country from Colombia. The teacher answered that the farthest country from Colombia is Indonesia, which is located in Asia. Based on this, the teacher mentioned that Indonesia is our antipode, that is, the place diametrically opposite to the ours, that is, on the other side of the Earth.

- [2] For her part, my friend Camila asked how long it takes for a plane to go around the world. Julián's voice was heard from the back of the room for whom his <u>greatest</u> passion is airplanes and he explained to our classmate that everything depends on the kind of plane in which we travel, because the speed of a jet is not the same as the speed of an airplane with four engines, which is slower, and, even less, as the speed of an airplane with <u>only</u> two. Based on Julián's explanation, the teacher calculated that in a jet that flew around the Earth through the Equator, without interruption, it would take <u>approximately</u> thirty hours.
- [3] Later, the teacher told us that at the beginning of the 16th century, the famous Portuguese navigator Fernando de Magallanes began the feat of going around the world, which he could not conclude because he died before completing it; however, the men accompanying him finished his

project in three years minus twelve days such a feat was accomplished for the first time in the history of the humanity.

- [4] -Three years! –We all exclaimed, impressed.
- [5] "Yes," said the teacher, "of course those three years were not of continuous navigation."

Magallanes and his companions stayed for days, weeks and even months in the places that

they were getting to know; at times, they even had to fight savage tribes, and it was in the hands of one of these tribes that Magallanes died before he could end his journey.

- [6] The expedition left San Lúcar de Barrameda, Spain, and, after going around the world, returned to the place of its departure. Magallanes was the first to pass through the strait that now bears his name, the Strait of Magallanes, located at the southern tip, or south, of the American Continent. That trip was the most <u>extraordinary</u> feat of the past.
- [7] After Magallanes, Europe knew and dominated the ways of the world and, although today you exclaim in amazement: three years! what Magallanes and his team did almost four hundred years is one of the great achievements of civilization.

- [3] Merlin was as old as the roots of the oaks, he could compose poems with the sounds of the wind, his black eyes read the future and his spells could change it. ### **EARTH IN IMMINENT DANGER FROM CLIMATE CHANGE: US SCIENTISTS**

- [1] Planet earth is our home, the place where people, animals and plants cohabit.
- [2] Of all the planets in the Solar System, this is the only one in which there is life.
- [3] At present, our planet is in danger. Recent greenhouse gas emissions place the Earth dangerously close to drastic climate change that can spiral out of control, with great danger to humanity and other creatures.
- [4] Intensive efforts are <u>needed</u> to <u>reduce</u> emissions of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases, an action that will allow the climate <u>to be kept</u> within or close to the margins of the past.
- [5] This is mentioned in a paper entitled "Climate change and traces of gases", whose authors are headed by James Hansen, director of the Goddard Institute for Space Studies of the NASA, which was the first scientist to warn his country's Congress about global warming. The others are Makiko Sato, Pushker Kharecha, and Gary Russell, also from the Goddard Institute; David Lea from the University of California at Santa Barbara and Mark Siddall from the Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory at Columbia University in New York.
- [6] These specialists, from some of the leading institutions in the United States, have issued an <u>unequivocal warning</u> to the world: civilization itself is threatened by global warming.

They also make an implicit criticism of the United Nations Intergovernmental Committee on Climate Change (IPCC) for underestimating the scale of sea level rise in this century, caused by the melting of glaciers and polar ice sheets.

- [7] The "unnatural forcing" of the climate as a result of human emissions of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases threatens to generate a change in the climate that could "unleash a cataclysm "in the huge ice sheets of Antarctica and Greenland, scientists say.
